I am incredibly impressed at how well they have settled in their classrooms, adapting to their new routines, working with their teachers and busy learning and playing with their friends. Every time I have popped into the classrooms to see them they all have a big smile on their faces eager to say hello and share what they are doing – building houses in the construction area, looking at their feelings with The Colour Monster story, seeing which items will slide does a watery pipe, filling peg boards with numicom pieces or playing house in their role play corners. You should feel very proud of how quickly they have settled. We also welcome Mrs Duffy to our team as our school business manager.

Otters and Kingfishers have enjoyed their different busy learning activities. They are now experts at identifying different parts of the body and looking at the different continents around the world. 


News from Maple
