#### Writing

Draft and write by noting ideas, key phrases and vocabulary, and composing and rehearsing sentences orally.

Sequence sentences to form short narratives such as diary entries, short stories and retelling real events.

Write for different purposes including about fictional personal experiences, non-fiction and real events.

Reread and evaluate writing to check it makes sense and make simple revisions.

Read writing aloud with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.

Use new and familiar punctuation correctly.
Use sentences in different forms.
