Communication, Language and Literacy

Main texts:

Skills:

- To segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and know which letters represent some of them.
- To use vocabulary and forms of speech that are influenced by their experiences of books.
- To continue to enjoy a range of books
- To use the illustrations in books to retell the story/facts and read some simple key words.
- To consolidate level 1+ phonemes and to write CVC words. (Consonant, Vowel, Consonant)
- Begin to learn level 2+ phonemes and to write CVC words.
- To retell stories through pictures, words and role play.
- To write clearly identifiable letters.
- To learn the alphabet.
- To write labels and captions.

- Addition to 10 using 2 groups in part-whole model.
- Odds and evens numbers to 10.
- Doubling and Halving.
- Length and measure link to number and size.

Physical Development

- To be able to throw a ball with accuracy.
- To be able to catch a ball using two hands.
- To be able to manoeuvre around obstacles.
- To improve scissor skills and cut accurately
- To dress and undress without support.
- To use the correct tripod pencil grip.
